Use Position Statements to address the importance of visual arts education as a vital part of a well-rounded education.

Share Position Statements with state/province association members through newsletters, websites, and social media (add a link to the statements directly from your website).

Use Position Statement language for advocacy materials—even on posters for rallies, marches, and assemblies.

Utilize the Position Statements as a guide for responding to the needs of students and colleagues.

Refer to related Position Statements when working with administrators regarding issues affecting visual arts programs.

The Position Statements can help you make your case when presenting at school board meetings and with other stakeholders.

Use the Position Statements as guidance for collaboration with other arts organizations.
